Voting Process Mechanism

WHO will be Allowed to Vote?

- All fully onboarded partners who have executed a Partnership Agreement Letter will be allowed ONE vote.
- The registered voter will be the Point of Contact (POC) that was listed in the Partnership Letter.
 - If the registered voter/POC needs to be updated, the original point of contact listed in the Partnership Letter must email CERF@LAEDC.ORG directly with this request by Friday July 28th at 12pm.
 - If the POC is no longer with the organization, please have your new point of contact email our team to resubmit a new partnership letter and we will update the voter credentials.

What will the Voting Process Entail?

- At the beginning of the election window, registered voters will be issued a unique token via email. This secure token grants them access to cast their votes on a virtual ballot hosted on a splash webpage.
 - Once all votes on the ballot are cast, the token will be closed.
- Voting results will be shared after voting window closes.

- Proposed: Election 3 and Election 4 to fill vacant seats on the Affinity Hub Leads and Steering Committees
- Setting the framework/bylaws for the Steering Committee

2C. Identify a Decision Approval Process of the Steering Committee


The August 1st state mandated deliverable includes identifying a decision approval process of the Steering Committee. Options include:

1. **Majority Voting**: Decisions are made based on a simple majority. A proposal is approved when it receives the highest number of votes compared to other options.

2. **Supermajority Voting**: A higher threshold than a simple majority is required. A proposal will need a two-thirds majority to be approved. Used for significant decisions.





Dear Secretary Knox, Director Assefa and Director Myers:

As the Los Angeles County Fifth District Supervisor, this is to express my support, along with the 300 public, private, and non-profit members that make up the Community Economic Resilience Fund Los Angeles County High Road Transition Collaborative (CERF LA HRTC), who recommend changes to the Catalyst Program recently released by the CERF Interagency Team.

I commend the state for its commitment to preparing projects in disinvested communities and maximizing funding opportunities for CERF projects. The proposed Catalyst Program would allocate up to \$26.5 million to each of the 13 CERF regions for project pre-development activities. While the CERF Catalyst Program provides good direction on the types of items that should be funded (i.e., career coordinators, community asset surveys, revolving loan funds, improvement of anchor institutions, and project investments), I join with other stakeholders in Los Angeles County concerned with the decision by the state to reserve each region \$26.5 million.






